As part of our ongoing commitment to delivering safe and reliable electric service, Central Maine Power (CMP) will be replacing two transmission structures within the Portland Pipeline Corporation tank farm, located at 30 Hill Street in South Portland. These structures no longer meet CMP standards and must be replaced to ensure continued system reliability.

CMP is working to ensure that all improvements are performed safely and with minimal disruptions to the community and the environment.

Project Need

The structures have been inspected and identified as aging and in poor condition. Replacing them is necessary to strengthen the resilience of our electric system and maintain dependable service for our customers.

Project Scope

- Replacement of two transmission riser structures adjacent to Nutter Road.
- Existing wooden poles will be removed.
- New stronger, more resilient steel poles will be installed.

Estimated Timetable

• Construction: July 21-25, 2025

Work Hours and Impacts

Work activity periods will comply with town ordinances. Work will be conducted during daylight hours, utilizing existing access points, and will entail the use of heavy machinery. As a result, nearby property owners may experience:

- Increased traffic in and out of the tank farm.
- Typical construction noise, including backup beeping, should be expected.
