Woolwich, Arrowsic, and Georgetown

Project Overview

As part of our commitment to provide safe, reliable service to our customers, Central Maine Power (CMP) is performing work to improve the resiliency of our system and to strengthen service for local families and businesses.

These grid strengthening improvements will be made along Nequasset Road and Pumping Station Road in Woolwich, and along portions of Route 127 in Arrowsic and Georgetown, serving approximately 3,200 area customers. Improvements will include upgrading lines with stronger, more resilient structures and conductors as well as adding smart devices to reduce the risk of outages and restore service more quickly if one does occur.

CMP is reaching out to neighbors to ensure that all improvements are performed safely and with minimal disruption to communities.

Project Need

The purpose of this project is to improve the reliability of the area's distribution lines, which are currently prone to outages, and to improve the resiliency of the electric system.

Benefits to Customers

- Improving the reliability of service for 3,200 area customers.
- Improving the resiliency of the electric system.
- The bottom-line goal of this project is to help avoid outages and shorten the length of outages when they do occur so customers can count on having power when they need it most, even in challenging weather conditions.

Project Scope

This project will involve work to upgrade area lines. and will include:

- Upgrading lines with stronger, more resilient structures and conductor.
- Installation of smart devices.
- Preventative tree trimming for reliability.

Trees and Vegetation

Trees and vegetation will be trimmed or removed from the right of way to make room for the new line as well as reduce the potential for storm-related damage or outages. When needed, CMP will talk with landowners about trees outside the right of way that may pose a future danger to the line, always working with respect toward property, and with safety top of mind.

What to Expect

Work hours will comply with town ordinances and will be performed within the ME Department of Transportation right of way. Crews may be in your area to do work and return at a later date. We thank you for your patience as this important work is completed. Neighbors may experience:

- Some typical construction noise, such as vehicle backup beeping and the sound of heavy equipment operating.
- Increased vehicle traffic and minor traffic disruptions, including the use of flaggers and temporary lane closures. Crews will take great care to observe speed limits and use caution while traveling through your neighborhood.
